



Beginning January 1, 2018, J.P. Mascaro & Sons will be collecting Single-Stream Recycling for the Residents of Birdsboro Borough on Wednesdays

J. P. Mascaro & Sons will pick up the recyclables with a truck that resembles a trash truck. The collection truck has a compactor, so more material will fit in it allowing the hauler to be more efficient. The materials will then be taken to TotalRecycle in Birdsboro to be sorted and recycled.

What Can be placed out as Recyclables?

- ♻️ Paper and Cardboard
(no books, no contaminated pizza boxes)
- ♻️ Wax Cartons: Milk, juice, soup, flavored drinks and cartons can be recycled.
- ♻️ Aluminum
- ♻️ Glass (no window glass, mirrors or light bulbs)
- ♻️ Plastics #1- #7
(no toys, styrofoam or ceramics)

Why Recycle?

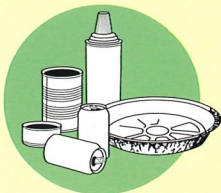
- ♻️ It's more convenient for the residents.
